Special Focus IV Annual Conference of GAPIO



Secretary General Report at Annual conference on 11th and 12th January 2014 Kolkata

Kolkata: India is facing an epidemic of non-communicable diseases like diabetes, heart disease and cancer, according to Dr. Prathap C Reddy, Chairman of Apollo Hospitals Group and founder president of Global Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (GAPIO).

It is estimated that by 2020, cardiovascular disease will be the cause of over 40 percent deaths in India as compared to 24 percent in 1990. By 2030, India will have the largest number of diabetic patients and will become the capital of diabetic patients in world. This is a dubious distinction that we do not need," Dr Reddy said while speaking at a two-day IV annual conference of GAPIO that began on January 11 here to discuss solutions in healthcare for improving health worldwide.

Addressing the delegates, Dr Amit Mitra, Hon'ble Minister of Finance, Commerce and Industry, Govt. of West Bengal, said he supported the idea of mass health insurance at a very low cost premium, availability of low cost generic medicines through public distribution system for public at large and role of telemedicine in providing healthcare to people in remote areas.

During the conference US-based gastroenterologist Dr Sanku Rao took over as President of GAPIO and his new team are: UK-based pediatrician and neonatologist Dr Ramesh Mehta as Vice President; Dr Anupam Sibal, pediatric gastroenterologist, hepatologist and group medical director of Apollo Hospitals, as Secretary General; Dr Nandakumar Jairam, Chairman, Columbia Asia Hospitals, as Joint Secretary; US-based allergist and immunologist Dr Sudhir Parikh as Treasurer and Dr. G Balreddy as authorized signatory.

Dr Rao informed the delegates that GAPIO had assisted in developing a web portal known as SwaasthIndia.com (www.swaasthIndia.gov.in) in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India,

British Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (BAPIO), UK and AAPI to provide essential healthcare services at various locations in India with the help of doctors from India and overseas.

"The website will act as a matchmaking portal where Indian medical diaspora can view and apply for these opportunities put up on this portal by various state governments," he said.

The conference was attended by over 300 delegates from India and overseas particularly from US, UK, Australia, Russia, Africa and Middle East. Renowned national and international faculty spoke at seven clinical sessions comprising of cardiac sciences, neurosciences, diabetes, gastroenterology and liver transplantation, robotics, nephrology/kidney transplantation and oncology.

At the conference Dr. Sandip Mukerjee - Dr B C Roy National Awardee, former honorary surgeon to the President of India and past president of Delhi State Chapter, Association of Surgeons of India and Dr Sudhir Parikh - Padama Shri awardee 2010, Elis Island Medal of honour (The highest civilian honour for US immigrants) and recipients of Pravasi Bhartiya Samman 2006 were honored with the GAPIO Lifetime Achievement Awards. GAPIO Service Excellence Award was given to 14 GAPIO members.

Liver transplant: Issues in India

Background: The incidence of carcinoma gall bladder is highest in North India. It is an aggressive malignancy with a dismal prognosis and almost all cases that present with surgical obstructive jaundice are unresectable. Surgery is the only curative option when the disease is limited. However even when the disease is limited, right hepatic artery may be invaded and the treatment options at this stage would require preoperative biliary decompression and once the bilirubin is < 5 mg/dl, preoperative portal vein embolization of right portal vein would be needed to allow for safe remnant liver prior to surgery. Right trisegmentectomy can then be planned. However this long process is not only expensive but more importantly the disease progresses from limited disease at the initial presentation to disseminated disease. If the right hepatic artery + right portal vein can be resected and then reconstructed, it may be possible to do a limited liver resection and bile duct reconstruction by hepaticojejunostomy.

The "Swaasth India" Web Portal

GAPIO has assisted in creation of a web portal known as Swaasth India (www.swaasthindia.gov.in), in collaboration with MOHFW Government of India, BAPIO and AAPI, and was launched by Hon'ble Dr. Harsh Vardhan Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare Government of India on 28th June at San Antonio Texas USA. This would provide essential healthcare services at various locations in India with the help of doctors from overseas and India. This portal would act as matchmaking site where Government of India and State Governments can post their requirements and Indian Medical Diaspora can view and apply for the same. Government of India has accorded the Swaasth India web portal as a Government of India official website.



Editorial: New Government-Vision on Healthcare

There is a wave of hope and positivity in the country with the Prime Minister Mr. Modi's government taking over this quarter and emphasizing health as a thrust area. In the first major guidance announced through the Union Budget 2014-15, the government has identified free drug and diagnostic services as a pathway to move towards the aim of Health for All. The setting up of two National Institutes of Ageing as announced in the Union Budget shall further the agenda of providing high quality geriatric care and research initiatives that could foster aspirations for the elderly in India.

The announcement of 4 new AIIMS in underserved areas of Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Vidarbha (Maharashtra) and Poorvanchal (Uttar Pradesh) shall take high quality secondary and tertiary care to the doorsteps of people of these regions and ease the load on hospitals of metro cities in the adjacent regions.

The strengthening of the States Drug Regulatory and Food Regulatory Systems addressed the key issue of quality and standardization in this crucial arena and shall help achieve the objective of providing high quality & safety of the food and drug products for the population at large. Another announcement highlighting the government's focus on Health for All and augmenting rural health care is the setting up of 15 Model Rural Health Research Centres addressing the health issues of rural population. The issues of lack of quality data about epidemiological trends and burden of disease shall be appropriately addressed by this initiative.

Establishing 12 new medical colleges in public sector shall increase the availability of affordable medical education and further improve the quality of medical services in the areas. Noticable here is the Hon'ble Health Minister's initiative to take up with the MCI the issue of restoration of approximately 6700 MBBS seats in government medical colleges for 2014 admission session.

The proposed initiatives reflect the strong commitment of the government to address the gap issues in Indian healthcare scenario. The landscape is encouraging for greater participation of the private sector to play an important role in the various initiatives ongoing and proposed.

The welcome approach of the government to allow overseas Indian doctors to visit India on locum and specific assignments besides cutting down delays for temporary registration shall encourage greater participation of overseas physicians of Indian origin for the cause of motherland. Besides the foregoing initiatives, the budgetary support for the existing programmes and institutions has either been maintained at same levels or enhanced in certain cases as the Six AIIMS institutions.

As per World Health Report, 2000: **The true measure of a nation's health systems performance is the achievement of three overall goals: good health, responsiveness to the expectations of the people and fairness of financial contributions.** The present Government has reaffirmed its commitment for achieving Health for all and the steps taken towards the same are laudable.

Meet Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Hon'ble Union Health Minister, Government of India



Dr Harsh Vardhan is an ENT surgeon by profession. He did his MBBS from GSVM Medical College, Kanpur and later went on to do MS with specialisation in ENT. In 1994, he launched Pulse Polio Programme in Delhi, which was then home to 10% of polio cases in India. On 2nd October, 1994 he organised the mass immunisation

of 1.2 million children. No immunisation programme in India before that had involved the marshalling of such awesome logistics. In 1997, under his bold leadership, the Delhi Prohibition of Smoking and Non-Smokers Health Protection Act was passed. The model of pulse polio created by Dr. Harsh Vardhan in 1994 was key to India achieving the Polio free status. His work on tobacco control is a model for other state governments to follow.

Dr Harsh Vardhan believes that a society does not become "modern" by just changing its superficial appearance. Progress and modernisation means adopting lifestyles that reflect collective maturity and vision. "You can't call yourself a superpower if Health for All, Universal Elementary Education and Environment Protection are mere slogans", he says.

He has been bestowed with various awards and honors like Director-General's Commendation Medal by World Health

Organization (1998), Rotary International's Polio Eradication Champion Award (2001), Paul Harris Fellowship by Rotary International (twice), Lions International Service Award (1995), IMA President's Special Award of Appreciation (1994) IMA Special Award to Eminent Medical Men for Distinguished Achievement of Highest Order (1995 & 1996) and many others. He was named "Doctor of the last Decade" (Swastha Ratna) by the New Delhi branch of the Indian Medical Association in the year 2002, for being the "noblest medical campaigner of the last decade".

Dr Harsh Vardhan has taken over charge as Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare in new Government lead by Shri Narendra Modi Hon'ble Prime Minister of India.

International Conference of Global Indian Doctors Held in Kolkata

GAPIO Presents Lifetime Achievement Award to Dr. Sudhir M. Parikh of U.S.A., and Dr. Sandip Mukerjee of India

More than 300 physicians from around the world gathered in Kolkata Jan. 11 and 12 for the International Conference of the Global Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (GAPIO). Representing approximately 1.2 million physicians globally, GAPIO believes it can make a significant contribution to quality and access issues that plague healthcare services worldwide.

The theme of the conference was "The Non Communicable Diseases Epidemic- Meeting the Challenges." A landmark achievement announced at the conference was the launch of a web portal, www.southindia.com, to match the skills of Indian physicians abroad with changing needs in various parts of India. State governments in India cooperated with GAPIO's members, the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPIO), and British Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (BAPIO), to develop the website where doctors abroad can view and apply for the opportunities listed by various State governments.

Indian-American physicians have played a key role in the organization, when in 2011, the President of AAPIO Dr. Sanku Rao, joined Dr. Prathap C. Reddy, chairman of Apollo Hospitals Group, established the organization.

The importance the U.S. to the organization was reinforced when the GAPIO Lifetime Achievement Award was given to Dr. Sudhir Parikh, an Indian-American physician, publisher of News India Times and recipient of India's Padma Shri award. The other lifetime award recipient was Dr. Sandip Mukerjee of India. An additional 14 members were bestowed the GAPIO Service Excellence Award.

"The criteria for the Lifetime Achievement Award (two given to Dr. Parikh) recognizes (two) 35 years of experience in the medical field and the service he has given to healthcare and to humanity."

Physician, philanthropist, publisher and India advocate, Dr. Sudhir M. Parikh, has been conferred the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Global Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (GAPIO) at its international conference held in Kolkata Jan. 11.

The award presented to him by Dr. Prathap C. Reddy, GAPIO's founder president and chairman of Apollo Hospitals Group, comes as a recognition of Dr. Parikh's "35-years of experience in the medical field and the service he has given to healthcare and to humanity."

While he is the recipient of one of India's highest civilian award, the Padma Shri, and also the recipient of the Pravasi Bharatya Samman, Dr. Parikh said that GAPIO's Lifetime Award is particularly gratifying because it has been conferred on him by his peers.

GAPIO is a global collective representing 1.2 million Indian physicians from across the world that includes members belonging to the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPIO), and British Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (BAPIO).

Lifetime Achievement Award Conferred on Dr. Sudhir M. Parikh

West Bengal Minister of Finance, Commerce and Industries, Anil Mitra, was the chief guest.

Several experts from faculties around the world, particularly from the 26 member countries represented in GAPIO, spoke at the seven clinical sessions covering cardiac sciences, neurosciences, diabetes, gastroenterology and liver transplantation, robotics, nephrology, kidney transplantation and oncology. The session "GAPIO making an impact" was the highlight of the conference.

The organization's top agenda is to bring Indian physicians from around the world together, Tandon said. "Doctors outside are not connected to doctors in India. If we can bring them together and with the latest technological skills they have gained abroad, these physicians can help India," Tandon said.

In that vein, last October GAPIO embarked upon what it says is India's first truly integrated comprehensive health scheme called "Total Health," at Angada village of Thanamangal Mandal in Chittoor district, Andhra Pradesh. The district has some 70,000 residents.

In January 2013, GAPIO held a free plastic surgery camp in Chittoor at the Apollo Hospital branch in Bilaspur. Around 100 surgeries were conducted and total care from preparation to post-operative follow-up was delivered at a total cost of \$40,000, Tandon said. The Angada project is a step-up in terms of total commitment for the long term.

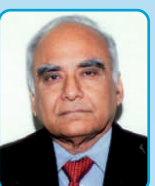
