

Report on GAPIO Charitable Clinic at Secunderabad

GAPIO Multispecialty Clinic was inaugurated by Dr. Sanku Rao; President - GAPIO to provide affordable medical services in the major slum area in Secunderabad. The clinic runs from 10 am to 1 pm every day. It has conducted five general and two specialty camps.

Ophthalmology camp was organized under the supervision of Dr. Sachidanand in which 84 patients were examined and free medical advice and medicines were given. Patients detected with cataract or surgical requirement were sent to Secunderabad Lions Eye Hospital. GAPIO is thankful to Lions Eye Hospital for giving free treatment to patient's referred by GAPIO Clinic.

Free specialty diagnostics camp was also organized to detect Anemia, Diabetes, Hypertension Thyroid disease, Osteoporosis (Blood sugar CBP, HBA1c and TSH) in which three pharmaceutical companies participated to distribute free medicines. Above 276 people attended the camp.

The clinic has adopted St.Joseph's old age home in mud fort with inmate strength of 30 old people from different backgrounds. Since most of the patients are women, a women camp was conducted on women's day for free examination of pap smear by Dr. Amrita Saluja MD DGO to detect cervical cancer. Pediatrician Dr. Suman offered free of cost services for 3 months daily in the morning.







Two medical officers, one Lab Technician, 1 ayah are attached to the clinic as employees. Specialist's like Ophthalmologist, General Physicians, Surgeons come on call, Clinic charges Rs. 20/- per patient and Rs. 50/- for specialty services, and nominal rates for Laboratory services.

Editorial: National Health Policy 2015

In a landmark move the Government of India after a gap of 13 years after the last health policy has been prepared draft National Health Policy 2015 (NHP 2015). The draft of new health policy has been released for public comments by the government. The new health policy revolves around the concept of access to affordable healthcare for all and aims to prioritize the role of government in health, organization and financing of healthcare services, prevention of diseases and promotion of good health. The NHP 2015 aims to achieve a significant reduction in the Out of Pocket expenditure due to health care costs and

reduction in number of households making health expenditures beyond their reach and consequent impoverishment

The National Health Policy identifies coordinated action on seven priority areas such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (reduction of water and vector borne diseases and declines in improperly managed solid waste); Balanced and Healthy Diets (reduction of malnutrition, and improved food safety); Nasha Mukti Abhiyan (addressing Tobacco, Alcohol and Substance Abuse); Yatri Suraksha (ensure road and rail safety); Nirbhaya Nari (issues relating to gender violence & improved sex ratio); Occupational & Environmental Health

The policy looks forward to development of strategies and institutional mechanisms in each of these seven areas. It has been proposed to set up seven Task Forces for formulation of a detailed Preventive and Promotive Care Strategy in each of the seven priority areas identified.

The policy also aims to address the role of public Hospitals as a cost effective social institution in addressing the secondary healthcare needs of the population. The critical gaps of Human Resources & skills as well as issues of quality are proposed to be bridged by adoption of mandatory NABH & NABL accreditation for Public Health facilities and strengthening of framework for health professional education.

The policy addresses fundamental issues of finance, technology, human resources, knowledge, governance & enabling legal framework for health including the right to health

The NHP 2015 is a concerted action plan that has the potential to transform the access to delivery of healthcare and lays down a framework for strengthening the healthcare infrastructure. The announcement of NHP 2015 & various schemes envisaged shall certainly bring the health sector as a key thrust area of good governance

Book Review: HEALER Dr. Pratap Chandra Reddy and the Transformation of India

At the age of fifty, when most people start planning fro retirement, Dr Prathap Chandra Reddy decided that he was going to revolutionize health care in India. In 1983, the renowned cardiologist launched the country's first professionally run private sector hospital system. Thirthy years later, Apollo Hospital has become one of the world's largest providers of high technology health care. In the areas of heart, liver and bone marrow transplants as also in knee and hip replacement surgery and robotic surgery, Apollo is an industry pioneer and a world leader

The book Healer describes Dr Reddy's inspirational story in the words of Pranay Gupte a well known international author, editor, foreign correspondent, teacher and senior strategist for conventional and New Media

The book captures the life and times of Dr Reddy, the originator of high end corporate health care in this country. Pranay Gupte followed Reddy around India for a whole year to write the book. It looks mostly at Dr. Reddys early life, leading up to a historic date, Spetember 18, 1983, when Apollos first hospital in Chennai, was inaugurated by Giani Zail Singh, the then Indian president.

The book also touches upon Dr. Reddy's ability to persuade people. Dr. Reddy's widespread influence can be clearly seen in the book which carries testimonials about him from various eminent personalities like Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi; William Jefferson Clinton, forty-second President of the United States of America; Dr John K Noseworthy, MD, President and CEO, Mayo Clinics; Jeffery Immelt, Chairman and CEO, General Electric; Ratan Tata, Chairman, Tata Trusts; Mukesh Ambani, Chairman and CEO, Reliance Industries. Dr. Reddy also has admires amongst spiritual gurus such as Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev, Founder, Isha Foundation and among various politician such as Kamal Nath, Kapil Sibbal, Nara Chandra Babu Naidu and N. Kiran Kumar Reddy.

Ratan Tata, Chairman, Tata Trusts, describes him as a "role model for many". Mukesh Ambani, Chairman and CEO, Reliance Industries, highlights his achievements as "women's empowerment in Indian business" Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev, Founder, Isha Foundation queotes that "His irrepressible enthusiasm at eighty is to be seen to believed".

With Andhra Pradesh being carved up into Telangana and Andhra regions, it is interesting that the book describes him as " an Andhra Reddy". He is a Rayalaseema Reddy from the Chittor region, while his wife Sucharitha comes from Khammam, which is a part of the Telangana region.

The book portrays Dr. Reddy as a man who is always thinking ahead and planning for the future After turning 80 in Febuary 2013. he set up a family council to oversee both transition and third-generation involvements in Apollo Hospitals. It seems that Reddys father has been proven right. It was he who wrote to the young Reddy urging him to return to India after finishing his training in the US when Reddy was toying with the idea of settling down in the country.
