2 Indian-origin doctors make India proud.

Dr Reshma Jagsi of the Medical School, and Bhramar Mukherjee of the School of Public Health, received the prestigious 2022 Sarah Goddard Power Award. Both of these Indian-Origin doctors are faculty members of University of Michigan.

Dr Jagsi is deputy chair of the Department of Radiation Oncology and director of the Center for Bioethics and Social Sciences in Medicine at U-M. She has led seminal studies quantifying under representation of women in authorship, editorial, principal investigator and leadership positions in medicine and in comparable compensation. She also is internationally recognized for research to strengthen autonomy in breast cancer patients and to individualize breast cancer care. "Dr. Jagsi is an international scholar, advocate and leading voice for gender and BIPOC equity, and a well-funded researcher who lifts many women through inspiration, collaboration, and mentorship.

Dr. Mukherjee, a professor of epidemiology and global public health, is chair of the biostatistics department. She also serves as the associate director for quantitative data sciences in the Rogel Cancer Center. Dr. Mukherjee is highly engaged in Precision Health and serves as the associate director for cohort development. Her research interests include statistical methods for the analysis of electronic health records, studies of gene-environment interaction, Bayesian methods, shrinkage estimation and analysis of high dimensional exposure data.

Dr. Raju has been on a crusade to eliminate avoidable blindness in parts of the world plagued by poverty and poor access to medical care.


He embodies a rare combination of exceptional talent and an insatiable urge to serve.

Message shared was - 'Safety of our society is in our hands and it always starts with YOU!'


National Girl Child Day

A progressive future is only possible if girls & women are empowered to pursue their dreams & contribute towards shaping the future.


GAPIO appealed everyone to take an oath to break all gender-based stereotypes, and recognize and celebrate the girls and women around the world.

It also made an appeal to all the Indian origin doctors present worldwide to join hands and help improve the health worldwide,


Happy Republic Day

'Role of Physician Scientist'



There is a need to encourage the physician scientists role in order to increase research work in Indian medicine. Hence, GAPIO appealed this on social platform by sharing a short article as:

The notion of Physician-Scientist has been central to the training of physicians in the US, although not many Indians are aware of this. It was born out of the need to:

- Further medical education research and innovation, and
- Systematize the training of physicians with a keen interest in biomedical research.

While trained as a clinician, each physician-scientist must possess skills lying at the interface between medicine and science including laboratory research, which requires a rigorous scientific methodology. Considering this, the National Medical Commission (NMC) plans to make it an integral part of medical education. It plans for a combined MD-PhD or dual degree program that can be made possible by

collaborating with eminent medical institutions. The role of a Physician scientist will help bring the clinical experience back to the lab and then direct it towards investigations and research.

Why so? Because they are skilled at patient care and thus can find out the practical unmet problems that need solutions. This helps foster good research work.


Physician-scientists, who are highly trained in medical research, diagnosis, and patient care, play a critical role in solving some of the greatest healthcare challenges we face today.

They also have an integral part of the academic and research communities focusing on improving our understanding of disease and health, thereby supporting the development of new diagnostic tests and treatments.

By providing physician-scientists access to multi-disciplinary education, and giving them hands-on clinical experience spanning across different settings, we can help harness the vast potential for physician-scientists.

Congratulations to all the Padma Shri Award Winners

Dr Himmatrao Bawaskar, an Indian Physician from Malad, is world famous for his path-breaking research on deaths caused by the sting of the red scorpion. His reputed publications about the issue through case studies in various journals drew the interest of the international medical fraternity in the subject. For the past 40 years, he has been working at a health centre at Mahad of Raigad District - Maharashtra focusing on saving the locals and tribals from scorpion and snake bite poisoning





Dr Prokar Dasgupta an Indian-origin Physician from United Kingdom is the Professor and Chair of Urology at King's College London. He is a pioneer in the field of Robotic Surgery. He has numerous firsts in the field including first randomized controlled trial of robotic urology as well as being the founder of what is called the "Dasgupta Technique" which is a method of injecting Botox into the bladder wall using a flexible cystoscope. His team is recognised internationally for the Guy's robotic cystoprostatectomy technique for bladder cancer and is the leading European group among the International Robotic Cystectomy Consortium (IRCC). He was the first to Use of da Vinci robot to perform keyhole surgery as part of kidney transplant.

Dr Lata Desai a 80 year old doctor along with her husband Dr Anil, left their life in the US and came back to dedicate to rural development. In 1980 they founded Society for Education, Welfare and Action-Rural (SEWA Rural) in Jhagadia, Bharuch. The society runs various programmes for health and welfare for the rural population in the area including a 200 bedded Kastubra Hospital serving patients from 3,000-odd villages as well as neighbouring states.. health training, eye checkup, Mahila Vikas society and many more





Dr Sunkara Venkata Adinarayana Rao-, a 82-year-old orthopedic surgeon from Andra Pradesh is noted for his work for poor people particularly polio victims under his Free Polio Surgical and Research Foundation, He has gained respect across India, especially in North India, for his treatment of polio victims. He performed more than one lakh surgeries to date. He won many awards in his six decades of service as a doctor.

Dr Veeraswamy Seshiah- A Tamil Nadu- Renowned Diabetologist, he was the first professor of Diabetology in India and was responsible for the establishment of the first Department of Diabetology in India at the Madras Medical College. He is Founder Patron, Diabetes in Pregnancy Study Group of India. In the past also he has received the number of awards for his contributions to the field of Diabetology, including the Dr. B C Roy National Award





Late Dr Balaji Tambe A pioneer in the field of Ayurveda, is well known to take the field of Ayurveda and Yoga to the world. He was the founder and source of inspiration for all the activities carried out at Atmasantulana Village. A Spiritual Leader, Dr Tambe passed away last year at a private hospital in Pune on Tuesday following a brief illness

Dr Bhimsen Singhal A popular Neurologist from Maharashtra is the Director of Neurology at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences in Mumbai, India. Prior to this appointment, he was the Honorary Professor and Head of Department of Neurology at The Grant Medical College, Mumbai. He has helped train over 200 neurologists and prominent in the promotion of neurology including Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease etc. He discovered the entity of megalencephalic leukodystrophy with a specific gene defect in Agarwal community. In the past also he has received the number of awards for his contributions to the field of Neurology including the Dr. B C Roy National Award





Dr Vijaykumar Vinayak Dongre Known for his work for Leprosy Treatment, Dr Dongre dedicated his entire life in leprosy control in urban and rural areas in Maharashtra.


