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Indian-origin Professor Dr. Swathi Arur named 'Emerging Leader in Health and Medicine Scholar'

Dr. Swathi Arur, an Indian-origin Professor and Deputy Chair of Genetics at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, has been selected as one of the 2022 Emerging Leaders in Health and Medicine Scholars by the National Academy of Medicine (NAM). She is the first MD Anderson faculty member to be appointed to this prestigious group since its creation in 2016.

Her passion for health improvement was evident since her undergraduate days at the University of Delhi in 1991-1994, where she started a non-governmental organization focused on providing better healthcare for children with HIV.

She earned her Ph.D. in Microbiology from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences in 2001 and continued her postgraduate work at the University of Connecticut, where she led efforts to integrate quantitative mass spectrometry with cell cultures in apoptosis research, one of the earliest instances of this cutting-edge proteomics technology.

“Awareness” - key to fighting disease like diabetes: Dr. Smita Joshi on ITV Gold

Dr. Smita Joshi and members of her family have become the face of spreading awareness about diabetes, one of the major diseases affecting children in India, but also identified among the top chronic conditions diagnosed among Indian-Americans and South Asians in the United States.

“To fight against any disease, awareness is the only weapon we have. We saw that in the pandemic,” Dr. Joshi said during her interview on ITV Gold held on Sept. 6, 2022. Diabetes is a major cause of blindness, heart attacks, and kidney-related problems, she added.

During her interview with Parikh Worldwide Media’s ITV Gold television service (PWM-ITV), Dr. Joshi spoke enthusiastically about her extraordinary campaign and her efforts to bring Americans behind it.

Her campaign has received the endorsement of Dr. Sudhir Parikh, Padma Shri recipient and Chairman of PWM-ITV, who expressed full support for Dr. Joshi’s campaign.

Dr. Joshi gave an inspiring account about four generations of her family being involved in medicine and serving India. Starting with her grandfather Dr. Vasdev Raval, followed by her father Dr. Anil Raval, then herself, and today, her own children. Dr. Joshi was born and brought up in Unjha Nagar, a small village in the District of Mehsana from where current Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi hails.



Physicians hold free Health Fair in Chicago



The Indian American Medical Association, Illinois (iamaill.org), in collaboration with the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI), hosted its annual Community Health Fair in Chicago on Sunday, August 28, 2022. Continuing with the tradition of offering free medical services to the needy members of the local population, dozens of physicians and volunteers, mostly of Indian origin, worked to make the Fair a success.

Close to two dozen physicians from various specialties provided medical services at the day-long event that catered to the needs of more than one hundred registrants.

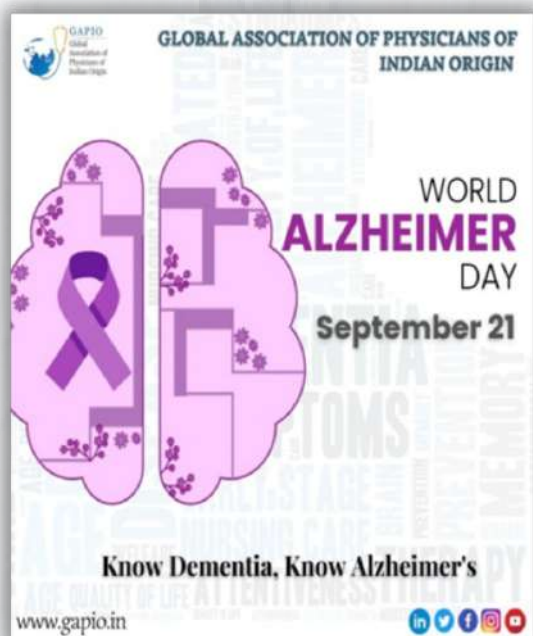
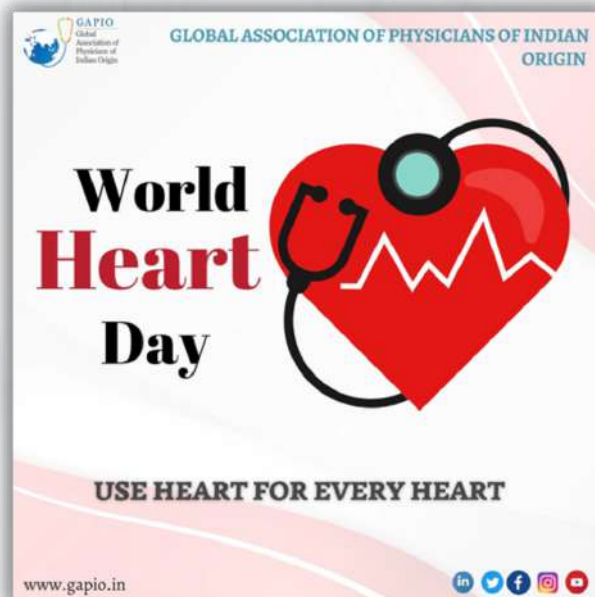

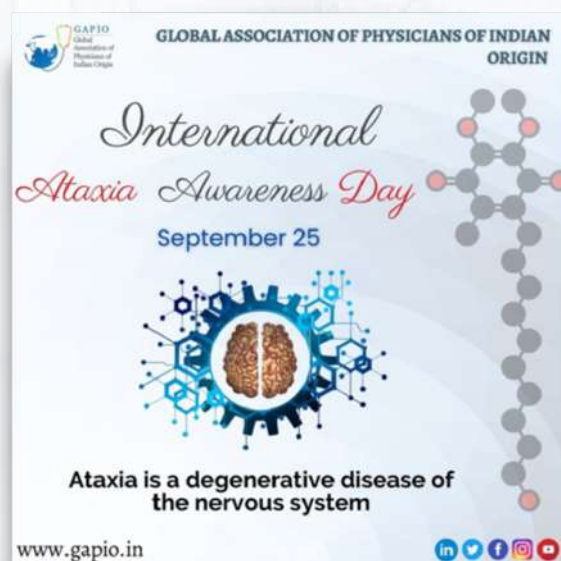
World Ataxia Day

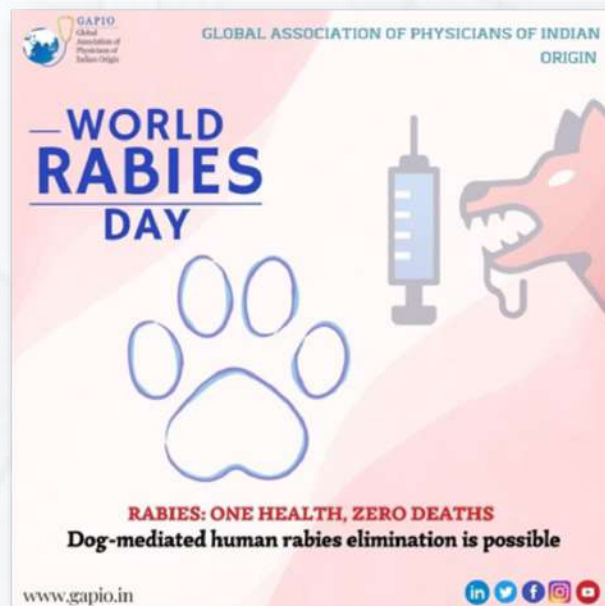
World Rabies Day

GAPIO also appealed to work together to help put an end to this disease once and for all.



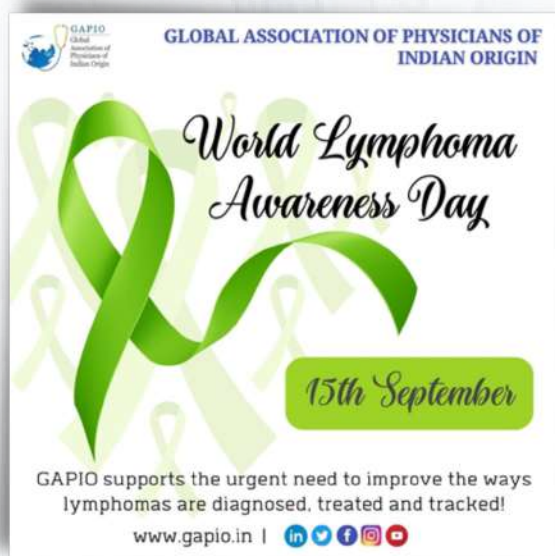
World Lymphoma Day

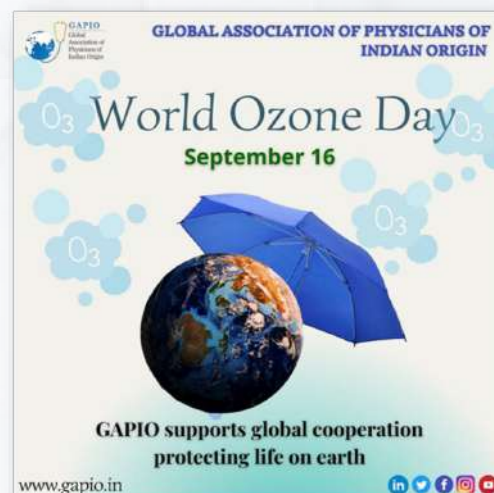
World Ozone Day

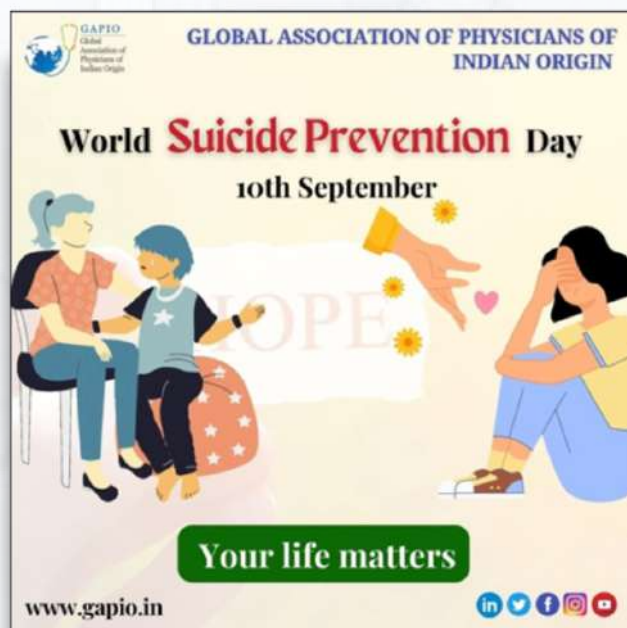
World Suicide Prevention Day

World First Aid Day

On account of World First Aid Day, GAPIO shared the below message:

Lifelong first aid is everyone's responsibility. To check an injured or ill person follow the steps recommended by Red Cross:

- 1 CHECK the scene for safety, form an initial impression, obtain consent, and use personal protective equipment (PPE)
- 2 If the person appears unresponsive, CHECK for responsiveness, breathing, life-threatening bleeding, or other life-threatening conditions using shout-tap-shout
- 3 A If the person does not respond, responds but is not fully awake, is not breathing or is only gasping, or has life-threatening bleeding or another obvious life-threatening condition, CALL the emergency

3 B If the person is responsive or responds to stimulation and is fully awake and does not appear to have a life-threatening condition: Interview the person (or bystanders, if necessary), and ask questions about signs and symptoms, allergies, and medications and medical conditions (SAM). Do a focused check based on what the person told you, how the person is acting and what you see.

4 After completing the CHECK step, call for help. Then, give CARE based on the condition found and your level of training

We all have the skills and knowledge to respond to a potential emergency. You must take time to learn more about first aid so that you are prepared when (not if) an emergency arises.

GAPIO appealed to encourage first aid training for all the community members.
