

Dr. Arun Prasad Conferred Honorary Membership of the Turkish Bariatric Surgery Society



GAPIO Marked World Stroke Day: Reinforcing the Urgency of Early Action and Community Awareness



GAPIO Celebrated Diwali: Honouring the Festival of Lights and the Spirit of Healing



When communities are trained to recognise cardiac arrest, initiate hands-only CPR, and use automated external defibrillators (AEDs), survival rates rise dramatically.

For healthcare professionals, this day reaffirms a shared responsibility that extends beyond hospital walls. By teaching CPR to students, caregivers, and neighbourhood groups, and by advocating for AEDs in public spaces, clinicians help create a society where lifesaving skills are widely understood and confidently practiced.

GAPIO reflected on the deeper message of World Restart a Heart Day:

- Timely action from the community bridges the gap between collapse and clinical care.
- Every trained individual becomes a vital link in protecting lives.
- A culture of preparedness fosters resilience and readiness during medical emergencies.

By observing this day, GAPIO reaffirmed its commitment to building heart-safe communities—where awareness is widespread, response is swift, and every person feels empowered to act.

Together, we can strengthen the chain of survival and give more people the chance to return home to their loved ones.

Together, we remain Unique and United in building a more inclusive, compassionate, and equitable future.






GAPIO Celebrates Dussehra: Honoring the Triumph of Wisdom, Resilience, and Healing

2. Start Small and Measure Impact

3. Demand Transparency from Vendors

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
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
